**Effect to be given to the recommendations
of sectoral meetings**

**(b) Tripartite Meeting on Human Resources
Development, Employment and
Globalization in the Hotel, Catering and
Tourism Sector
(Geneva, 2-6 April 2001)**

1. The Tripartite Meeting on Human Resources Development, Employment and Globalization in the Hotel, Catering and Tourism Sector was held in Geneva from 2-6 April 2001, chaired by Mr. D. Willers (Government member of the Governing Body).
2. The Meeting considered a report prepared by the Office.¹ It unanimously adopted a set of conclusions on human resources development, employment and globalization in the hotel, catering and tourism sector. It also unanimously adopted three resolutions, concerning:
 - (a) measures to promote employment in the hotel, catering and tourism sector during the low season, including vacation programmes for senior citizens;
 - (b) occupational health and safety in the hotel, catering and tourism sector; and
 - (c) improving occupational equality for men and women in the hotel, catering and tourism sector.
3. These texts, together with a summary of the proceedings of the Meeting, appear in the *Note on the Proceedings*, which is appended to the present paper.² Paragraphs 16 and 17 of the conclusions and operative paragraphs of the resolutions call for certain action by the ILO.

4. *The Committee on Sectoral and Technical Meetings and Related Issues may wish to recommend that the Governing Body authorize the Director-General to communicate the Note on the Proceedings containing the texts mentioned in paragraph 3 above:*

(a) to governments, requesting them to communicate these texts to the employers' and workers' organizations concerned;

(b) to the international employers' and workers' organizations concerned; and

(c) to the international organizations concerned.

5. *The Committee on Sectoral and Technical Meetings and Related Issues may wish to recommend that the Governing Body request the Director-General to bear in mind, when drawing up proposals for the future work of the Office, the wishes expressed by the Meeting in paragraphs 16 and 17 of the conclusions and in the relevant parts of the resolutions.*
