CAN SAVE LIVES

The COVID-19 global pandemic has affected nearly all areas of life for billions of people around the globe, including profound, unprecedented impacts on the world of work.

In many countries, economic lockdowns and mandatory quarantines have found workers in many sectors transitioning overnight to teleworking arrangements, essential workers adapting to new safety and health protocols, increased amounts of work and many workers forced out of work, among other profound and far reaching impacts. Occupational safety and health, both during and after the pandemic, will be of paramount importance to employers, workers and governments, including ensuring that workplaces are adequately prepared and resilient for any subsequent peaks of infection from COVID-19 as well as future pandemics.

This year's World Day for Safety and Health at Work, commemorated on April 28th, 2020 focused on the theme "Stop the pandemic: Safety and health at work can save lives" and addressed different facets of responding to outbreaks of infectious diseases at work, specifically focusing on the current COVID-19 pandemic.

The ILO urged Governments to take action to prevent and control <u>COVID-19 in the workplace</u>, with active involvement and dialogue with employers' and workers' organizations. The ILO stressed that conducting risk assessments to ensure workplaces meet strict occupational safety and health criteria is essential.

On the 28th of April 2020, a **global expert panel webinar** was organised by the ILO and hosted on Zoom with livestreams on YouTube and Facebook. The webinar was viewed by over 12,000 participants from around the world.

The panel of experts included Joaquim Pintado Nunes (Branch Chief, LABADMIN/OSH), Manal Azzi (Senior OSH specialist), Silvana Cappuccio (ILO Workers' Group member, Italy), Kris De Meester (Senior Advisor, Federation of Enterprises, Belgium), Richard Jones (Head of Policy and Regulatory Engagement, Institute of Occupational Safety and Health), Lode Godderis (Leuven Centre for Environment and Health, Department of Public Health and Primary Care), Chris Laszcz-Davis (President, the Environmental Quality Organization), Michelle M. Robertson (CPE, Executive Committee, International Ergonomics Association), Barry Kistnasamy (Department of Health, South Africa) and Teresita S. Cucueco (Department of Labor and Employment, Phlippines).

The panelists discussed safety and health at work during the COVID-19 pandemic, the mental health impact of COVID-19 in different work scenarios, but also how to prepare for a return to work. A special focus was given to vulnerable groups and lessons learned for the future. The panelists were prompted by various questions that were sent in by webinar participants from around the world in advance.



The World Day received **global press and social media coverage** from around the world.







Furthermore, ILO constituents around the world organized **regional and national social media campaigns**, lectures, webinars, virtual dialogues and other various themed events.

Participants in these events included OSH professionals, employers, workers, government officials, students and various other people interested in the topics being discussed. The various webinars included, in some cases, several hundreds or thousands of online participants and viewers.

Regional events and national events included, among others, regional events in the African Continent, the Latin American and Caribbean Region and events hosted in countries across Asia, Europe, Africa, North America, South America and the Pacific Region. While many of these events focused broadly on COVID-19 and health and safety at work, others focused specifically on topics such as youth engagement, healthcare workers, returning to work and the impact of COVID -19 on OSH, among others.
