A briefing session is being held to address youth employment. Across the globe, the economic crisis has had a dramatic impact on the challenges facing young people seeking jobs. Between 2008 and 2009, the youth unemployment rate has seen the largest annual increase on record. What's more, unemployment rates are only the tip of the iceberg. Young people are prone to working longer hours under informal, intermittent and insecure work arrangements characterized by low productivity and earnings and reduced social protection.
